Right Start flight sergeant opening

The 193rd Special Operations Force Support Squadron is looking for a high-caliber, non-commissioned officer to take on an active role in a leadership capacity. This is a great opportunity for those who desire to take on a first sergeant role in the future. This opportunity is a temporary, 2-year appointment with a projected start time of May 2014. All applicants must have approval from their unit commander in order to apply.

Job responsibilities include:

- Mentoring future Airmen to be productive members of the 193rd SOW;
- Scheduling and conducting UTA training to prepare members for Basic Military Training;
- Conducting mock fitness assessments to ensure members are able to meet fitness standards;
- Maintaining accountability and conducting administrative duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Open to technical and master sergeants only;
- Individual must be professional in both appearance and conduct;
- Passing Air Force fitness score required;
- Position is open to drill-status Guardsman and technicians.

The application package must include a current fitness program score sheet; memorandum of endorsement from the applicant's immediate supervisor and commander (member must maintain their DSG position); a memorandum of intent; and a military resume (optional civilian resume). HRA position announced

There is an enlisted vacancy for an assignment at the 193rd SOW for the position of human resource advisor. The closing date for this opening is Feb. 22 and is for existing E-8 or promotable E-7. The HRA position is a controlled grade position funded for traditional guard only.

The HRA's role is to advise command leadership on issues leading to the enhancement of the organization's culture; promoting opportunities for all ANG members to maximize their individual potential for success without regard to their cultural differences. HRAs are responsible for working with key individuals in the human resource process to achieve diversity management objectives within the organization.

Mandatory requirement for the wing HRA position: Attend the ANG Human Resources Advisor Orientation Course within 12 months of appointment to the position. For a complete listing of duties and responsibilities of the wing HRA, Please review ANGI 36-2110, The human resources advisor.

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be in the grade of senior master sergeant or master sergeant who are eligible for promotion to senior master sergeant upon appointment to the human resources position under the provisions of the retraining promotion program in ANGI 36-2502, Promotion of Airman, Air National Guard, and must be eligible for promotion on or before the date of assignment to the Unit Manning Document position.

- Must be highly motivated and capable of fulfilling the role of the wing human resources advisor as prescribed in ANGI 36-2110.

- Must have exceptional verbal and written communication skills.

- Must have effective leadership, managerial and organizational skills for the position.

- Must uphold and demonstrate a professional image in representing the organization in public and at military events.

- Must be able to travel periodically to external and internal organizations.

- Position requires knowledge of computer software products for word processing and graphical presentations.

- Must meet minimum weight and body fat standards.

Submit completed resume, military records review, personal letter of intent outlining career goals and objectives, current passing fitness test, and any letters of recommendation. There is an officer commissioning opportunity for a traditional guardsmen, 17DX Cyberspace Operations Officer, at the 193rd Special Operations Communications Squadron. The application package must include a cover letter, resume, Last three OPRs/LOEs, physical fitness report, minimum of one letter of recommendation, AF Form 24 (for non-commissioned candidates), and AFOQT scores (for non-commissioned candidates).

Requirements:

- All applicants will be considered for this position without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, gender, political affiliation, kinship or other non-merit factors.

- For entry into this specialty, undergraduate academic specialization is desirable in mass or public communication, communicative arts, journalism, public relations, advertising, or one of the behavioral sciences (sociology or social psychology).

- This position requires commission as an officer in the U.S. Air Force. For those without a prior military service commission, successful completion of the nine week Officer Training School at Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala., is required.

Responsibilities:

- Plans, budgets for, executes, and evaluates effectiveness of public affairs programs.

- Analyzes military mission, unit policies, and relationship with population of local communities to determine requirements for communication.

- Develops working relationship with media representatives.

- Develops and maintains liaison with representatives of civilian organizations, governmental agencies, and other publics.

- Develops plans and operational procedures for communication about aircraft incidents, natural disasters, environmental incidents, and other spot news events concerning military activities.

- Plans communication programs to ensure military and civilian members are informed about current issues and policies of the local installation, major command, and Headquarters U.S. Air Force.
